He has participated in solo and group exhibitions internationally and at The United Nations, The Henry Gregg Art Gallery, Cooper Union, Carnegie Hall, The Salmagundi Art Society, The Michael Schimmel Arts Center and Pace University in New York City.

At the young age of 15, Yeak experienced the official opening of his personal gallery in Malaysia – 'Ping Lian @ The Art Commune' featuring a permanent showcase of his works in Malaysia, established by The Art Commune and supported by JPMorgan Chase Foundation (2009) in collaboration with ABWM. Ping Lian was also filmed at the official opening of the gallery for a documentary, 'Asia's Wonder Kids' for Channel News Asia (CNA International and CNA Singapore). Ping Lian Yeak is one of very few recognized "prodigious" savant artists in the world. He creates magnificent works of art using charcoal, acrylic, water color, ink and oil. His art works have been featured in exhibitions in the US, UK, Australia, Germany, Japan, Korea, Singapore and Malaysia.
